What does the number mean?

On D-Day, more Americans lost their lives. At the peak of Vietnam, hundreds of U.S. troops died each week. And in one September morning, 2,792 died in crumbling New York towers.

Still, 1,000 is a grim milestone.

In addition to the American deaths, more than 120 foreign troops of the U.S.-led coalition are dead. Half were British forces. Nearly 100 Americans have died in operations in Afghanistan and about 35 others in related action in Pakistan and other countries.

Madonna's bodyguards held after brawl

TEL AVIV, Israel -- Police detained two bodyguards of pop star Madonna today after a brawl with photographers waiting for the singer outside her Tel Aviv hotel.

Two of the photographers and a policeman who tried to break up the fight were injured, said police spokesman Liat Pearl.

"Two security guards were detained for questioning by the Tel Aviv police department," Pearl said.

The pop diva has been in Israel since Wednesday, along with 2,000 other students of Kabbalah, or Jewish mysticism.

Madonna's visit to the country has sparked a media frenzy with the local newspapers devoting pages detailing her luxury hotel suite and even her menu for the Jewish New Year celebrations, but journalists have been kept at a distance during the visit.

The scuffle broke out this evening as the photographers trailed Madonna from a restaurant to her hotel.

The Israeli bodyguards knocked one of the photographers to the ground and kicked him in the face before attacking a second one who tried to intervene, according to a cameraman on assignment for Associated Press Television News.

Madonna had already entered her hotel when the fight broke out.

Madonna was raised a Roman Catholic, but she has taken an interest in Jewish mysticism in recent years.

She has adopted the Hebrew name Esther, wears a red thread on her wrist to ward off the evil eye, and reportedly refuses to perform on the Jewish Sabbath.

Designer Donna Karan and Marla Maples, an ex-wife of Donald Trump, were among those traveling with 12 Madonna, according to the Los Angeles-based Kabbalah Center, sponsor of the trip.

WASHINGTON - Drafts of a report from the top U.S. inspector in Iraq conclude the country had no weapons stockpiles, but say there are signs Saddam Hussein had dormant programs he hoped to revive at a later time, people familiar with the findings said.

In a 1,500-page report, the head of the Iraq Survey Group, Charles Duelfer, will contend Saddam was importing banned materials, working on unmanned aerial vehicles in violation of U.N. agreements and maintaining a dual-use industrial sector that could produce weapons.


Duelfer also says Iraq only had small research and development programs for chemical and biological weapons.

The report concludes Saddam had intentions of restarting weapons programs at some point, after suspicion and inspections from the international community waned.

After a year and a half in Iraq, however, the United States has found no weapons of mass destruction — its chief argument for overthrowing the regime.

The War of 1812

The War Hawks gained such power in the Congress of the United States that their words were listened to with growing attention. It became increasingly obvious that these aggressive men were bent on war with Great Britain. By Autumn of 1811, they were openly demanding an immediate invasion of British North America.

By February of 1812, Congress had ordered the creation of a volunteer army of 50,000 men. On June 18th 1812 came a declaration of war against Great Britain. Oddly enough on June 23rd 1812 Great Britain had revoked the restrictions on American commerce, thus eliminating one of the chief reasons for going to war.

However the War Hawks had displayed much more energy in talking about war than in planning and preparing for war. At the beginning of hostilities there were about 7,000 men in the regular forces and these were commanded by senior officers who were old, incompetent or lacking in experience.

Congress had voted for war, but seemed reluctant to spend the necessary funds upon equipment and supplies. A bill introduced into Congress with the purpose of increasing the size of the American Navy was turned down by the members. Volunteer soldiers were badly fed and disgracefully clothed. In winter, the unfortunate sentries who patrolled the Canadian-American border shivered and shook on duty because they lacked overcoats.

It soon became clear that great numbers of Americans were not at all united in approving the conflict with Great Britain. Many felt that it was a contest fought for purposes other than those which had been declared by the War Hawks. These feeling were put into eloquent words by the famous American orator and statesman, Daniel Webster, when he spoke in Congress:

Whoever would discover the causes which have produced the present state of things, must look for them, not in the efforts of the opposition, but in the nature of the war in which we are engaged ... Quite too small a portion of public opinion was in favor of war to justify it originally. A much smaller portion is in favor of the mode in which it has been conducted ... Public opinion, strong and united, is not with you in your Canada project ... The acquisition of the country is not an object generally desired by the people ... You are you say, at war for maritime rights, and free trade. But they see you lock up your commerce and abandon the ocean. They see you invade an interior province of the enemy. They see you involve yourselves in a bloody war with native savages; and they ask you if you have, in truth, a maritime controversy with the Western Indians, and are really contending for sailors' rights with the tribes of the Prophet.

In the late summer of 1814 a British fleet was sent into Chesapeake Bay to make a diversionary attack against Washington and Baltimore.

When the lead British ships appeared in Chesapeake Bay in August 1814 the Americans had no idea where they were headed or what their intentions were. The British sailed up the Patuxent River and moved ashore a force of nearly five thousand crack troops fresh from the battle fields of Europe.

In the American capitol there was a curious lack of alarm when word arrived that the British invasion force had come ashore. At the new Congress building there was no serious worry that the capitol of the United States might be attacked. At the White house or President's Palace there was little concern, the leaders of the United States had been assured by the Secretary of War that there was no danger.

John Armstrong assured the president that the British might attack Baltimore but the young capitol was in no danger.

Mr. Madison rode to the front to watch the up coming battle, he sent a note to his wife:

"My dearest I have passed among the troops who are in high spirits and make a good appearance. The reports as to the enemy has varied from hour to hour, the last and probally best information is that they are not very strong and are without cavarly and artillery and of coarse they are not in a condition to strike at Washington."

Dolly Madison the presidents wife was now hearing differently. Mrs. Madison knew what was a foot better than her husband the British moved relentlessly on Washington knowing the effect it would have on the people of the United States to have their nations capitol attacked.

The British soon got word that the only troops standing between them and Washington were militia units. The main British force moved into a Washington suburb and after a brief battle the militia units broke and ran, in the words of one American observer:

"They ran like sheep being chased by dogs".

Several hunderd U.S. sailors came ashore to fight but they could not stop the British advance for very long.

The military problems of Mr. Madison and his cabinet faced on the Canadian frontier were now being repeated at the door of the nations capitol.

Once the battle had commenced Mr. Madison and the Secretaries of War and State decided it would be better to withdraw to a position in the rear.

Ahead of the President word shot back to Washington that all was not well. The British invasion force was now clearly in on the capitol, the presidents wife Dolly Madison dashes of a note to her sister:

"Will you believe it my sister, we have a battle or skirmish near the city. I am still within sounds of the cannons, Mr. Madison comes not. May God protect us. Two messengers come in and asked me to leave the capitol, I must stay here and wait for my husband."

While Mrs. Madison showed great courage at the White House. Mr. Madison was tracking down the Secretary of War to find out what steps were in the works to meet the final British assault, he was shocked and disheartened to find out there was no plan.

The 25th of August 1814, the British approached the heart of Washington, march down Constitution Avenue bearing a flag of truce and demand a surrender. Suddenly from a house window the flag of truce is fired apon.

The British troops rushed into the house where the shots had been fired from, and put all who were found in the house to the sword and then reduced the house to ashes. They went onto burn and destroy every building connected to the government.

While Washington burned, the president and his cabinet became fugitives fleeing westward deep into the hills of Virginia. At the White House Mrs. Madison was persuaded to leave also, and soon after the British troops arrived.

When these British soldiers who had been sent to destroy the President's house entered they found a dinner that had been made for about forty people. They are every bit of food and drank every bottle of wine, then started to destroy the White House.

Washington D.C. the capitol of the United States was a city on fire, what had started two years earlier as the invasion and conquest of Canada had now turned into a defensive war.

Voting is your duty as a citizen. How you vote will be strictly up to you. But, don't let political differences if you know about them, affect your friendships. History will tell who was right (maybe). In the meantime we need good friends, especially those who can be candid and friends at the same time.
- 2. By participating, we will help ourselves as well as the the other seminarians deal with these important issues as we approach the election. Nobody has the "right answer" except for themselves. We all owe it to each other to respect and support each other. We are all Americans or guests. We will all benefit or have to live with the outcome.
- 3. Please keep your remarks brief and to the point.
- 4. Have faith -- in each other and yourselves. **Our republic has lasted over 200 years**. We are the oldest living Constitutional democracy. Our **Constitution** limits the power of the leaders and **guarantees the rights of its citizens**. That 200 years has not all been smooth sailing. From time to time, generally in "times of war", **leaders have** usurped the authority of the Congress, **violated the Constitution and the rights of the people** who rightly or wrongly have acquiesced, being promised security. Something has always brought us back from the brink, but I don't think we ever make a full recovery. Best we keep our rights and respect for each other intact in the first place. Let's not let anything we say or do be harmful to each other.
- 5. Have fun We always do.

How would we go about that?

What if it turns out that not one of the candidates is perfect? In fact, not only not perfect, but really has a "checkered" history.

Has the incumbent accomplished anything he has set out to do? Has what he has accomplished made your world better?

What about the challengers? Anybody with enough stroke to run for president, will have got there with help from a lot of friends. What kind of friends?

What are the work histories of the candidates? What if one is a liar? What if they are both liars?

But you need to vote for one (Do you?)

It just goes on and on, doesn't it? But on November 2nd the country will make a decision, and even though the job description is limited: the office of **President of the USA is** the most powerful in the world, both as a matter of prestige and the willingness of the legislative branch to abdicate the authority they hold in trust for the people to the executive who willingly accepts it and puts it right to work.

Every so often in American politics, we come upon an ethical problem more delicate and more depressing than the existence of outright evil. It is the problem of mackerels in the moonlight.

John Randolph, the eccentric Virginia aristocrat, invented this phrase in the 1820's and used it against at least two of his Congressional colleagues. Henry Clay, he complained, was so brilliant, so capable and yet so corrupt that, "like a rotten mackerel in the moonlight, he both shines and stinks."

The phrase has lived on not only because of its cleverness, but because it defines a moral ambiguity most of us find very hard to understand. We look for heroes to represent us, although we rarely find them. We take a certain perverse pleasure in unmasking hypocrites and dispatching blowhards who fail to deliver on their promises. The leaders we have trouble dealing with are those of obvious talent and genuine achievement who turn out to have displayed appalling ethical insensitivity — or worse.

At a deeper level, though, today's moonlight mackerels are political leaders who convince themselves they can compartmentalize their lives and careers, setting the embarrassing parts aside in private containers where they need not contaminate acts of genuine idealism and tangible achievement. This may have been possible once; it was, despite occasional insults, for Henry Clay, and it was still possible in the time of John F. Kennedy. But it is a dangerous trick to attempt in the 21st century. Eventually it will come out. Too many reporters, prosecutors and bureaucratic whistleblowers are working overtime to uncover it. There are very few airtight compartments left in American public life.

This is a good thing in that it will discourage quite a few elected officials in the next generation from mischief they might otherwise have been tempted to risk. It is a bad thing in that it destroys or fatally weakens political leaders whose downfall ultimately benefits no one. Buddy Cianci, Paul Patton and George Ryan are among those leaders.



Bush Banter (not Bashing)

Does any of this matter? What troubles me is less Mr. Bush's advantage three decades ago and more his denial today. Mr. Bush's own route to avoid the draft underscores the disparities in America, yet his policies seem based on a kind of social Darwinism in which the successful make their own opportunities. His tax cuts and entire outlook seem rooted in ideas not of noblesse oblige, but of noblesse entitlement.

One fall day in 1973, when Mr. Bush was a new student at Harvard Business School, he was wearing a Guard jacket when he ran into one of his professors. The professor, Yoshi Tsurumi, says he asked Mr. Bush how he **wangled a spot in the Guard**.

"He said his daddy had good friends who got him in despite the long waiting list," recalls Professor Tsurumi, who is now at Baruch College, part of the City University of New York. Professor Tsurumi says he remembers Mr. Bush so vividly because he was always making outrageous statements: denouncing the New Deal as socialist, calling the S.E.C. an impediment to business, referring to the civil rights movement as "socialist/communist" and declaring that "people are poor because they're lazy." (Dan Bartlett, an aide to Mr. Bush, denies that the president ever made these statements.)

Do the numbers.


