




Virginia Polytechnic and State University researchers have developed a large molecule, or supramolecular complex, that combines sub-units that absorb light with sub-units that accept electrons.

Snow to Remain Treasury's Chief, White House Says


WASHINGTON, Dec. 8 - President Bush asked Treasury Secretary John W. Snow on Wednesday to remain in his job, the White House said, after weeks in which Republicans close to the White House had talked openly about his impending departure and said administration officials were interviewing possible successors.

While White House officials did not say how long Mr. Snow might stay on, the announcement came after Mr. Bush and his top aides determined they had to put a stop to an embarrassing public breach over who should occupy the nation's most central economic policymaking post, several officials said.

With the dollar hovering at historic lows against the euro and Mr. Bush preparing for a twoday meeting next week to lay out economic strategy for the next term, one senior administration official said that "this was no time to send a signal of uncertainty."

•••

But other officials said Vice President Dick Cheney had felt out or interviewed potential candidates for the job. The White House apparently did not warm to the alternatives, who included former Senator Phil Gramm of Texas and Gerald L. Parsky, a wealthy lawyer and venture capitalist who served as an assistant Treasury secretary in the Ford administration.

Seniors Head to Canada for Cheaper Drugs

Seniors Head to Canada by Train to Buy Drugs, Some at About Half the Price They Pay in U.S.

NEW YORK Oct 12, 2004 — With a button pinned to her jacket that read "Drug Companies Make Me Sick," Mildred Fruhling, 76, joined a small caravan headed to Canada by train to buy cheaper prescription drugs.

The drugs she and her husband need are available at home in Edison, N.J., at a cost of about \$7,000 a year. In Canada, where she's going with more than 20 other senior citizens, she'll buy a three-month supply for about half the U.S. price.

"I don't think it's a fair scenario, so I'm going to Canada to get the word out that we have to change the system," Fruhling said.

The caravan, dubbed "The Rx Express," started Monday in Miami and stopped in Manhattan on Tuesday to add passengers. Participants will leave for Toronto Wednesday morning and arrive in the evening.





ASHINGTON, Dec. 7 - Successive commanders at the Air Force Academy failed over the course of a decade to acknowledge the seriousness of sexual assault and harassment at the Colorado Springs campus, and the service only recently imposed measures to change a climate that tolerated abuse of female cadets, the Pentagon inspector general has found.

The inspector general's findings, released Tuesday by the Pentagon, said sexual assaults against women were reported almost 150 times over 10 years but that little action was taken until the accusations became public in 2003.

"We conclude that the overall root cause of sexual assault problems at the Air Force Academy was the failure of successive chains of command over the past 10 years to acknowledge the severity of the problem," wrote Joseph E. Schmitz, the Defense Department inspector general, in a letter accompanying the report, dated Dec. 3.

"Consequently, they failed to initiate and monitor adequate corrective measures to change the culture until recently," Mr. Schmitz added.

Eight Air Force officials were found to share responsibility for "creating, contributing to or abiding the unique sexual assault reporting program" at the academy and for "the resulting problems," the inquiry found.

A summary of the report released by the Pentagon did not include their names, nor did it offer recommendations for discipline. All of the academy's senior leaders from the decade under scrutiny have been replaced.

2 C.I.A. Reports Offer Warnings on Iraq's Path

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6 - A classified cable sent by the Central Intelligence Agency's station chief in Baghdad has warned that the situation in Iraq is deteriorating and may not rebound any time soon, according to government officials.

The cable, sent late last month as the officer ended a yearlong tour, presented a bleak assessment on matters of politics, economics and security, the officials said. They said its basic conclusions had been echoed in briefings presented by a senior C.I.A. official who recently visited Iraq. ...

But over all, the officials described the station chief's cable in particular as an unvarnished assessment of the difficulties ahead in Iraq. They said **it warned that the security situation was likely to get worse, including more violence and sectarian clashes, unless there were marked improvements soon on the part of the Iraqi government, in terms of its ability to assert authority and to build the economy.** ...



Beijing warns EU on weapons ban

China has warned the EU that it risks damaging bilateral ties unless it lifts a 15-year embargo on selling arms to Beijing.

Chinese Vice Foreign Minister Zhang Yesui said the ban, imposed after the 1989 crackdown on protesters in Tiananmen Square, was "outdated".

Mr Zhang also denied that lifting it would fuel an arms race with Taiwan.

But analysts say the row is more about geopolitics and domestic economies than human rights.

The US is concerned that arms sold to China by the EU could be used against Taiwan and risk sucking the US into a regional conflict.

France and Germany, meanwhile, believe China could prove a fertile market for their arms and related industries.



Energy developments

Primary energy consumption increased in all regions of the world in 2003. The strongest increase was in Asia Pacific, up 6.3%, while North America recorded the weakest growth, at 0.2%. As in 2002, coal was the fastest-growing fuel, rising by 6.9% globally.

Oil consumption was also relatively strong but the growth of natural gas use was held back by a steep, priceinduced fall in US consumption. Hydroelectric generation was up by only 0.4% and nuclear generation suffered only the second contraction in its history.





OIL AND GAS LIQUIDS 2004 Scenario





Oil and Gas - a Short Period of History for Great Britain

For several years now, Members of ASPO have presented predictions showing, amongst other things, that the production of oil and gas in the UK sector of the North Sea will occupy no more than a few pages in the history books. This is now confirmed by the UK Department of Trade and Industry that recently published a plot showing that by the year 2020 it is more or less all over.



The UK and Ireland have built an infrastructure that requires natural gas in large quantities, which in the future they will need to import. For the coming years, it may be possible to import from Norway, but that requires Norway to step up its production, which means in turn that its resources will decline much faster. It risks being soon in the same situation as is the UK today.

In a long term it is very big risk for Europe to rely on Norwegian natural gas. It would be better for Europe if Norway did not increase its production. That would keep the present export lines full for longer.



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Saving half the oil America uses, and substituting cheaper alternatives for the other half, requires four integrated steps:

• **Double the efficiency of using oil**. The U.S. today wrings twice as much work from each barrel of oil as it did in 1975; with the latest proven efficiency technologies, it can double oil efficiency all over again.


• Apply creative business models and public policies to speed the profitable adoption of superefficient light vehicles, heavy trucks, and airplanes. Combined with more efficient buildings and factories, these efficient vehicles can cut the official forecast of oil use by 29% in 2025 and another 23% soon thereafter—52% in all.

• **Provide another one-fourth of U.S. oil needs by a major domestic biofuels industry.** Recent advances in biotechnology and cellulose-to-ethanol conversion can double previous techniques' yield, yet cost less in both capital and energy.

• Use well established, highly profitable efficiency techniques to save half the projected 2025 use of natural gas, making it again abundant and affordable, then substitute part of the saved gas for oil. If desired, the leftover saved natural gas could be used even more profitably and effectively by converting it to hydrogen,

These four shifts are fundamentally disruptive to current business models. industry leaders often get blindsided by disruptive innovations—technological gamechangers—because they focus too much on today's most profitable customers and businesses, ignoring the needs of the future. In the 108-year history of the Dow Jones Industrial Average, only one of 12 original companies remains a corporate entity today—General Electric. The others perished or became fodder for their competitors.

Over the decade of the post-Cold-War period, however, almost everything has changed. The Cold War world was a bipolar world; the 21st century world is – for the moment, at least – decidedly unipolar, with America as the world's "sole superpower."

America's strategic goal used to be containment of the Soviet Union; today the task is to preserve an international security environment conducive to American interests and ideals. The military's job during the Cold War was to deter Soviet expansionism. **Today its task is to secure and expand the "zones of democratic peace;"** to **deter the rise of a new greatpower competitor**; **defend key regions of Europe, East Asia and the Middle East**; and to **preserve American preeminence** through the coming transformation of war made possible by new technologies.

From 1945 to 1990, U.S. forces prepared themselves for a single, global war that might be fought across many theaters; in the new century, the prospect is for a variety of theater wars around the world, against separate and distinct adversaries pursuing separate and distinct goals.

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Rebuilding America's Defenses: Strategy, Forces and Resources for a New Century

MODERNIZE CURRENT U.S. FORCES SELECTIVELY, proceeding with the F-22 program while increasing purchases of lift, electronic support and other aircraft; expanding submarine and surface combatant fleets; purchasing Comanche helicopters and medium-weight ground vehicles for the Army, and the V-22 Osprey "tilt-rotor" aircraft for the Marine Corps.

CANCEL "ROADBLOCK" PROGRAMS such as the Joint Strike Fighter, CVX aircraft carrier, and Crusader howitzer system that would absorb exorbitant amounts of Pentagon funding while providing limited improvements to current capabilities. 









The Population of the World

The solid line in this graph shows estimates of the size of the world's population over the last two millenia. The estimates from 1800 to 1991 are based on more accurate data than those before. The dotted line shows what would happen if exponential growth continued to the year 2100.

As you can see, the world's population has been growing exponentially (except during the years of the <u>black death</u>). How long will it continue to do so? (Since the graph was drawn, the world's population has reached 6.4 billion; that is, in 2004 we are still on course.) But can it continue indefinitely? Surely not.

Predicting Future Population Size

With a 2004 rate of natural increase in Mexico of 2.1%, its population would be expected to double in 33 years (0.69/0.021 =32.9) from its 106 million people now to some 212 million in 2037. Will it?


No one knows for certain. What actually happens to population growth depends on a number of factors. Some of these can be estimated with some confidence, some cannot.

Two that can are:

•the **age structure** of the population and

•the total fertility rate (TFR).

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This graph (based on data from the UN Long-Range World Population Projections, 1991) gives 5 estimates of the growth of the world population from now until 2150, assuming that TFRs decline from the 1991 value of 3.4 to the values shown.

•A value of 2.06 will produce a stable population of about 11.5 billion.

•A value 5% below that (1.96) will cause the population to drop back to close to its present value (6.1 billion) while

Earth's Atmosphere

The gases in the atmosphere, and their percentage of the whole atmosphere, are as follows:

- nitrogen N2 78.084
- oxygen O2 20.946
- argon Ar 0.934

carbon dioxide CO2 0.035

water vapor H2O variable

neon Ne 0.0012

helium He 0.0005

nitrous oxide NO2 0.0002

methane CH4 0.0002

xenon Xe 0.0002

But even at very low levels, the molecules of CO_2 , H_2O , methane, and nitrous oxide play an important role in the history of the earth. These molecules continually absorb and re-emit the infrared radiation coming up from the surface.

Half of the emitted energy goes up toward space - and half goes down back toward the surface. The net effect is that these *greenhouse gases* trap infrared energy, keeping the atmosphere and the surface hotter than they would be if not for the atmosphere.

It is found that for many centuries before the industrial revolution, the percentage of CO_2 was 0.028%; it then increased rapidly to the current 0.035% during the last two centuries. While surprising in its candor and tone, Thompson's remarks were emblematic of the distance he has sometimes maintained from the Bush White House, even as he was helping to accomplish one of its signature achievements — passage of the Medicare prescription drug law a year ago.

A popular four-term governor of Wisconsin, Thompson arrived in Washington four years ago with a record for innovative solutions on welfare and other issues.

Thompson was in the drugs from Canada and other countries. Americans pay the highest prices in the world for medicines. Thompson signaled recognition of the political force behind the drive for lower prices when he commented in May that importation from Canada spotlight on allowing the importation of lower-cost prescription was inevitable.

"I think it's coming," Thompson said, adding that he would recommend Bush not stand in the way of Canadian imports.




