



Marsha Farmer was in high spirits on the afternoon of June 19, 2002. She'd been slogging through the city bureaucracy for 17 months, and now it seemed that repairs to her flood-damaged northwest Houston house might begin.

That afternoon, Farmer started reading a repair estimate prepared by a contractor in the city's home repair program. She stopped short when she got to a section dealing with her roof.

Something was wrong.

The estimate called for enough plywood and shingles to replace her roof twice. She thought this must be a typo, but as she read further, she saw more

errors and prices that seemed unreasonably high.

No good deed goes unpunished!

She filed suit against the city and the Urban League in September 2003, asking that the U.S. government be awarded damages equal to three times the amount of the misspent funds, as the False Claims Act allows. She also asked that the city and the Urban League pay fines and that she be compensated as a whistle-blower.

U.S. District Judge Keith Ellison dismissed her suit in August 2006, ruling that Farmer could not establish fraudulent intent because of the multiple layers of contractors and subcontractors between HUD and the people whose homes were repaired.

Moment of triumph for whistle-blower takes a tragic turn

Woman, whose fight for housing repair revealed government waste, dies in her home

On Friday, a city inspector arrived at Marsha Farmer's Houston home to deliver long-awaited news: Her mold-damaged house would get fixed — repairs she first applied for through a city-run program in 2001.

That day, the Houston Chronicle had published a front-page article about Farmer's experience with the home repair program and her role in exposing its mismanagement. Farmer was happy and optimistic.

But the next day, the woman who spent almost eight years trying to stop the waste of public funds in the home repair program died in her northwest Houston house. The 58-year-old was discovered on her sofa by a neighbor, said Farmer's son, Bryan Nelson. A friend of Farmer's had contacted the neighbor after growing concerned when Farmer failed to show up for a visit, Nelson said.

"It seemed like she'd been taking a nap on the couch and just didn't wake up," Nelson said.

The Harris County Medical Examiner's Office said the cause of death had not been determined Sunday. Nelson said police who came to the scene said it appeared his mother had died of natural causes.

With her death, her impact as a whistle-blower takes on a poignant new dimension. Farmer's complaints to government officials about the federally funded home repair program and subsequent lawsuit helped trigger an investigation by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development that led to a temporary shutdown of the program.

Late whistle-blower's son urges city to finish home repair

The city of Houston should proceed with planned repairs to the home of Marsha Farmer, who died Saturday after struggling for years to stop the waste of public funds in the city's home repair program, Farmer's son said Monday.

"My intent is to try to get the city to go ahead and do it," said Bryan Nelson of Pearland, Farmer's only child. "I don't want to let them off the hook because she died, to let them sweep this under the rug."


However, Richard Celli, Houston's director of housing and community development, said the home repairs are limited to low-income people who are elderly or disabled and live in the house being repaired. Whoever inherits the property would have to meet these requirements for the repairs to proceed, he said.

Nelson, Farmer's heir, said he wouldn't qualify. He suggested, however, that the city has a moral obligation to complete a task that he said it should have performed years ago.


Farmer, disabled since 1998, first sought help from the program in January 2001. She later obtained documents that helped trigger a federal investigation that led to a temporary shutdown of the repair program and other sanctions against the city.

After the Houston Chronicle recently inquired about her case, the city dispatched a team to assess possible repairs to her home, which was flooded by Tropical Storm Allison in June 2001. On Friday, the day before her death, an inspector showed Farmer the plans for extensive repairs that would cost \$45,000 to \$50,000.



Obama presses lawmakers to OK bailout funds

Tax and immigration blunders tripped up President-elect Barack Obama's highly regarded nominee for treasury secretary, arguably the most important position in the next Cabinet that assumes power in the midst of a spectacular U.S. economic downturn.

Timothy Geithner disclosed to senators Tuesday that he failed to pay \$34,000 in taxes from 2001 to 2004, a last-minute complication in an otherwise smooth path to confirmation. Senate Democrats are pressing to schedule a quick confirmation hearing for Geithner on Friday, but Republicans have yet to sign off on expediting the hearing by the Senate Finance Committee.

The Geithner miscue proved another unwanted distraction for Obama, who was on Capitol Hill wrestling to build congressional consensus for his economic rescue efforts.



The first half of 2008 was marked by drought. On Aug. 1, Houston was running a year-to-date rainfall deficit of more than 7 inches. Then hurricane season arrived with a vengeance. By late October, Houston had surpassed its normal annual rainfall total, and finished the year more than 5 inches above normal.

Old Farmers Almanac: Global cooling may be under way



DUBLIN, N.H. - The Old Farmer's Almanac is going further out on a limb than usual this year, not only forecasting a cooler winter, but looking ahead decades to suggest we are in for global cooling, not warming.

Based on the same time-honored, complex calculations it uses to predict weather, the Almanac hits the newsstands on Tuesday saying a study of solar activity and corresponding records on ocean temperatures and climate point to a cooler, not warmer, climate, for perhaps the next half century.

"We at the Almanac are among those who believe that sunspot cycles and their effects on oceans correlate with climate changes," writes meteorologist and climatologist Joseph D'Aleo. "Studying these and other factor suggests that cold, not warm, cli mate may be our future."

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"I do," Burris said with a grin as Vice President Dick Cheney administered the oath of office to the former Illinois attorney general who takes Obama's place as the Senate's only black member.

More than a week after his colleagues were sworn in, Burris was seated without objection or a roll call vote, even though Majority Leader Harry Reid had said senators would have their voices heard on whether to accept his appointment.

White House press secretary Dana Perino said the new decision was "based on information that has subsequently come to light," including on the extent and nature of Toussie's prior criminal offenses. She also said that neither the White House counsel's office nor the president had been aware of a political contribution by Toussie's father that "might create an appearance of impropriety."

"Given that, this was the prudent thing to do," she said.

In a different part of town, another young fighter and his wife were getting ready to go see her brother, 20, who had been wounded in southwest Gaza City two nights ago while bringing food to fighters. The fighter, 27, in dark jeans and Timberland-style boots, swaggered with words about Islam and duty to his people. Hamas is doctrinally opposed to Israel's right to exist.

"It's either victory while alive, or martyrdom," he said. "Both ways are victory."

His wife, in a white head scarf, agreed.

"Two days ago, he was very tired and he didn't want to leave the house," she said. "I told him you have to leave, you have a responsibility."

But the sight of her brother unconscious in the hospital bed seemed to jolt the couple into an alternate reality, one where they were vulnerable and afraid. The man's eyes glistened with tears as he asked the doctor question after question.

Back outside, the woman regained her composure.

"I prefer you as a martyr," she said to her husband.

"What if I am injured?" he asked.

She repeated her preference for death.

He took up the accusation that Hamas fighters hid behind civilians. Fighters, in a way, are both, he argued, and are accepted by many residents as defenders. People bring them food, he said. Sometimes they oppose rockets being launched nearby, but often they do not.

"I'm a civilian, and I'm a fighter," he said.

For Arab Clan, Days of Agony in a Cross-Fire

GAZA — Israel's attack has razed buildings and upended families in much of crowded Gaza. But few neighborhoods suffered more than Zeitoun, a district of eastern Gaza City. And few families felt the wrath of the Israeli military more than the Samounis.

A house in the Zeitoun district was hit during the Israeli offensive, leaving 30 in the family dead. Ahmed al-Samouni, 16, survived.

Israeli troops swarmed Zeitoun shortly after the ground invasion of Gaza began a week ago, and members of the extended Samouni family said they were moved from house to house as soldiers took over the neighborhood. On Monday, with nearly 100 Samounis huddled together in one house, the shooting and the shelling began, according to accounts of family members and witnesses that were partly corroborated by the Red Cross and the United Nations.

There comes a moment when the imbalance in resources reverses the relationship between government and cartels. Government officials, seeing the futility of resistance, effectively become tools of the cartels. Since there are multiple cartels, the area of competition ceases to be solely the border towns, shifting to the corridors of power in Mexico City. Government officials begin giving their primary loyalty not to the government but to one of the cartels. The government thus becomes both an arena for competition among the cartels and an instrument used by one cartel against another. That is the prescription for what is called a "failed state" — a state that no longer can function as a state. Lebanon in the 1980s is one such example.

It is important to point out that we are not speaking here of corruption, which exists in all governments everywhere. Instead, we are talking about a systematic breakdown of the state, in which government is not simply influenced by criminals, but becomes an instrument of criminals — either simply an arena for battling among groups or under the control of a particular group. The state no longer can carry out its primary function of imposing peace, and it becomes helpless, or itself a direct perpetrator of crime. Corruption has been seen in Washington — some triggered by organized crime, but never state failure.

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



Report: CIA Uses Little Blue Pills to Entice Afghan Warlords

The growing Taliban insurgency has forced the CIA to get creative in how they obtain certain information from Afghan warlords and tribal leaders.

In an effort to win over fickle warlords and chieftains in Afghanistan and get information from them, CIA officials are handing out Viagra pills in exchange for their cooperation, the Washington Post reports. "Whatever it takes to make friends and influence people - whether it's building a school or handing out Viagra," an agency operative, speaking on the condition of anonymity, told the Post.

The growing Taliban insurgency has forced the agency to get creative in how they obtain certain information from Afghan warlords and tribal leaders, including Taliban movements and supply routes. CIA operatives use everything from toys and school equipment to tooth extractions to their advantage and note that if Americans don't offer incentives, others, including Taliban commanders, will.

Afghan veterans told the Post that the usual bribes of choice - cash and weapons - aren't always the best options because they can garner unwanted attention and fall into the wrong hands. "If you give an asset \$1,000, he'll go out and buy the shiniest junk he can find, and it will be apparent that he has suddenly come into a lot of money from someone," Jamie Smith, a veteran of CIA covert operations in Afghanistan, told the Post.

Feds ignored clear meltdown warnings

Under pressure from banking industry, U.S. government eased lending rules

WASHINGTON - The Bush administration backed off proposed crackdowns on no-money-down, interest-only mortgages years before the economy collapsed, buckling to pressure from some of the same banks that have now failed. It ignored remarkably prescient warnings that foretold the financial meltdown, according to an Associated Press review of regulatory documents.

In 2005, faced with ominous signs the housing market was in jeopardy, bank regulators proposed new guidelines for banks writing risky loans. Today, in the midst of the worst housing recession in a generation, the proposal reads like a list of what-ifs:

• Regulators told bankers exotic mortgages were often inappropriate for buyers with bad credit.

•Banks would have been required to increase efforts to verify that buyers actually had jobs and could afford houses.

- Regulators proposed a cap on risky mortgages so a string of defaults wouldn't be crippling.
- Banks that bundled and sold mortgages were told to be sure investors knew exactly what they were buying.
- Regulators urged banks to help buyers make responsible decisions and clearly advise them that interest rates might skyrocket and huge payments might be due sooner than expected.

Those proposals all were stripped from the final rules. None required congressional approval or the president's signature.

Government Receipts & Expenditures


Crude Oil Price



S&P vs OIL (2 yr.)




S&P 500 – 1 Year



Globalization creates interlocking fragility, while reducing volatility and giving the appearance of stability. In other words it creates devastating Black Swans. We have never lived before under the threat of a global collapse. Financial Institutions have been merging into a smaller number of very large banks. Almost all banks are interrelated. So the financial ecology is swelling into gigantic, incestuous, bureaucratic banks – when one fails, they all fall. The increased concentration among banks seems to have the effect of making financial crises less likely, but when they happen they are more global in scale and hit us very hard. We have moved from a diversified ecology of small banks, with varied lending policies, to a more homogeneous framework of firms that all resemble one another. True, we now have fewer failures, but when they occur I shiver at the thought.

Banks hire dull people and train them to be even more dull. If they look conservative, it's only because their loans go bust on rare, very rare occasions. But (...)bankers are not conservative at all. They are just phenomenally skilled at self-deception by burying the possibility of a large, devastating loss under the rug.

The government-sponsored institution Fannie Mae, when I look at its risks, seems to be sitting on a barrel of dynamite, vulnerable to the slightest hiccup. But not to worry: their large staff of scientists deemed these events "unlikely".

There is no way to gauge the effectiveness of their lending activity by observing it over a day, a week, a month, or . . . even a century!

We got off before for only a half trillion dollars

(...) the real- estate collapse of the early 1990s in which the now defunct savings and loan industry required a taxpayerfunded bailout of more than half a trillion dollars. The Federal Reserve bank protected them at our expense: when ''conservative'' bankers make profits, they get the benefits; when they are hurt, we pay the costs.

Hidden risks

Once again, recall the story of banks hiding explosive risks in their portfolios. It is not a good idea to trust corporations with matters such as rare events because the performance of these executives is not observable on a short-term basis, and they will game the system by showing good performance so they can get their yearly bonus. The Achilles' heel of capitalism is that if you make corporations compete, it is sometimes the one that is most exposed to the negative Black Swan that will appear to be the most fit for survival.

Black Swan and "Science"

As if we did not have enough problems, banks are now more vulnerable to the Black Swan and the ludic fallacy than ever before with "scientists" among their staff taking care of exposures. The giant firm J. P. Morgan put the entire world at risk by introducing in the nineties RiskMetrics, a phony method aiming at managing people's risks, causing the generalized use of the ludic fallacy, and bringing Dr. Johns into power in place of the skeptical Fat Tonys. (A related method called "Value-at-Risk," which relies on the quantitative measurement of risk, has been spreading.)

Please, don't drive a school bus blindfolded.

Ludic Fallacy (Wikipedia.org)

The ludic fallacy is a term coined by Nassim Nicholas Taleb in his 2007 book *The Black Swan*. 'Ludic' is from the Latin *ludus*, meaning 'play'. It is summarized as "the misuse of games to model real-life situations".^[1] Taleb characterizes the fallacy as mistaking the map (model) for the reality (see mapterritory relation), an inductive side-effect of human cognition.

It is a central argument in the book and a rebuttal of the predictive mathematical models used to predict the future --as well as an attack on the idea of applying naive and simplified statistical models in complex domains. According to Taleb, statistics only work in some domains like casinos in which the odds are visible and defined. Nassim's argument centres on the idea that predictive models are based on platonified forms, gravitating towards mathematical purity and failing to take some key ideas into account:

•It is impossible to be in possession of all the information.

•Very small unknown variations in the data could have a huge impact (the Butterfly effect).

•Theories/models based on empirical data are flawed, as events that have not taken place before cannot be accounted for.

Basic Wilderness Survival Skills From: British Columbia Outdoor Wilderness Guide

Fear - For anyone faced with a wilderness emergency survival situation, fear is a normal reaction. Unless an emergency situation has been anticipated, fear is generally followed by panic then pain, cold, thirst, hunger, fatigue, boredom and loneliness. It is extremely important to calmly assess the situation and not allow these seven enemies to interfere with your survival.

Pain - Pain may often be ignored in a panic situation. Remember to deal with injuries immediately before they become even more serious.

Cold - Cold lowers the ability to think, numbing the body and reducing the will to survive. Never allow yourself to stop moving or to fall asleep unless adequately sheltered. **Thirst** - Dehydration is a common enemy in an emergency situation and must not be ignored. It can dull your mind, causing you to overlook important survival information.

Hunger - Hunger is dangerous but seldom deadly. It may reduce your ability to think logically and increase your susceptibility to the effects of cold, pain and fear.

Fatigue - Fatigue is unavoidable in any situation so it is best to keep in mind that it can and will lower your mental ability. Remember that in an emergency situation this is often the bodies way of escaping a difficult situation.

Boredom & Loneliness - These enemies are quite often unanticipated and may lower mind's ability to deal with the situation.


Starting to change for Texas
