n.b. I have recently been made aware that it is legal for law enforcement to lie to anyone.



## 'Underwear Bomber' Umar Farouk Abdulmutallab Pleads Guilty

Umar Farouk Abdulmutallab, the man accused of trying to blow up Northwest Flight 253 on Christmas Day 2009 with a bomb in his underpants, changed his plea to guilty on all counts before saying he did it "to avenge the killing of my Muslim brothers and sisters."

After consulting with his lawyer, the "underwear bomber" was once again read the charges against him in a Detroit court today and after each one, he told the judge, "I plead guilty."

"The Koran allows every Muslim to undertake jihad,"

Abdulmutallab told the court after changing his plea. "I carried the device to avenge the killing of my Muslim brothers and sisters...

Unfortunately, my actions make me guilty of a crime."

Abdulmutallab called the failed explosives he had hidden in his underwear a "blessed weapon" and said he attempted to use it "because of the tyranny of the United States."

Abdulmutallab had originally pleaded not guilty to all charges, including attempted murder and attempted use of a weapon of mass destruction, but apparently changed his mind since the prosecution completed their opening arguments Tuesday.

# U.S. says it foiled Iranian-backed plot to assassinate Saudi ambassador


The United States said Tuesday that it had disrupted a plot to assassinate the Saudi ambassador to the U.S. conceived by elements of the Iranian Qods force.

The accusations came in a Justice Department criminal complaint unsealed Tuesday afternoon at a press conference featuring Attorney General Eric Holder, FBI Director Robert Mueller and a team of Justice Department prosecutors. The key suspect charged in the plot, a naturalized Iranian-American citizen identified as Manssor Arbabsiar, of Corpus Christie, Texas, was arrested late last month at John F. Kennedy Airport in New York; a second accused conspirator named in the complaint, an alleged Iranian Revolutionary Guards Corps-Qods Force official identified as Gohlam Shakuri, remains at large and is believed to be in Iran. The five-count criminal complaint also refers to other unnamed conspirators in the plot and suggested they also were members of the Qods force in Iran.

In a related action, the Treasury Department on Tuesday designated Arbabsiar and four alleged Iranian Qods force members, including Shakuri, Qasem Soleimani, Hamed Abdollahi, and Arbabsiar's cousin Abdul Reza Shahlai, as being connected to the alleged plot.

The alleged assassination plot --unraveled by federal agents with the Drug Enforcement Agency and FBI--was "conceived, sponsored and was directed from Iran" Holder said in a statement Tuesday. "The U.S. is committed to holding Iran accountable for its actions."



# Virus infects computers piloting U.S. drones

Posted: Saturday Oct 8, 2011 14:20:45 EDTA computer virus that logs keystrokes has infected computers used to remotely pilot U.S. drones over Afghanistan and other war zones, <u>Wired</u> reports. As far as the Pentagon knows, no classified information has been lost or transmitted outside.

The keystroke logger was first detected nearly two weeks ago at Creech Air Force Base, Nev., where most Predator and Reaper drones are guided, and has stubbornly resisted removal, sources told Noah Shachtman, who writes the Danger Room blog.

"We keep wiping it off, and it keeps coming back," one source said." We think it's benign. But we just don't know."

Shachtman writes that the infection "underscores the ongoing security risks in what has become the U.S. military's most important weapons system."



# Cybercrime becomes bigger threat to energy industry than terrorists

In years past, discussions about security in the energy industry usually focused on protecting refineries from terrorist attacks and overseas workers from kidnapping.

Today, the greater threat is the digital theft of competitive information or technical data by outside hackers or unscrupulous employees, speakers at an FBI-sponsored event on energy security said Wednesday.

"The shift from physical security to data security has been a significant one for all of us," said Russell Cancilla, Vice President and Chief Security Officer at Baker Hughes. "Theft of intellectual property, state-sponsored corporate espionage, those kinds of things have grown exponentially in recent years."

A few well-known incidents in the energy industry occurred in 2008, when computer systems owned by oil companies including ConocoPhillips, Marathon Oil and Exxon Mobil were reportedly hacked by outside forces seeking oil and gas lease bidding information. Sections of the U.S. power grid were also probed by outside forces in recent years, although it does not appear any damage was done.

# Few Tears Shed as Wall Street Braces for More Layoffs, Weak Q3 Results

By <u>Aaron Task</u> | <u>Daily Ticker</u> – Tue, Oct 11, 2011 12:36 PM EDT Put away the pitchforks, it looks like the axe is about to come down on Wall Street.

New York City Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli predicts the securities industry will shed another 10,000 jobs by the end of 2012, <u>The NYT reports</u>. That figure excludes most of the 30,000 bank tellers and other branch employees expected to lose their jobs at Bank of America.

DiNapoli also reported the average pay for securities industry employees in New York City rose 16.1% in 2010 to \$361,330, **almost six times greater** than the average salary for other private sector jobs.

In separate but related news, two former Census Bureau officials report the median household income in America fell 3.2% during the recession from Dec. 2007 to June 2009, and then fell another 6.7% during the so-called 'recovery' from June 2009 through June 2011.

Regulators in the United States and overseas are cracking down on computerized high-speed trading that crowds today's stock exchanges, worried that as it spreads around the globe it is making market swings worse.

The cost of these high-frequency traders, critics say, is the confidence of ordinary investors in the markets, and ultimately their belief in the fairness of the financial system.

"There is something unholy about them," said Guy P. Wyser-Pratte, a prominent longtime Wall Street trader and investor. "That is what caused this tremendous volatility. They make a fortune whereas the public gets so whipsawed by this trading."

Regulators are playing catch-up. In the United States and Europe, they have recently fined traders for using computers to gain advantage over slower investors by illegally manipulating prices, and they suspect other market abuse could be going on Regulators are also weighing new Reless for high-speed trading, with an international regulatory body to make recommendations in coming weeks

### Veterans worry about Gulf War illness funding

Posted: Wednesday Oct 12, 2011 20:03:52 EDTA congressional move to shift control of the flow of money to research a mysterious Gulf War illness has alarmed veterans of that conflict who fear the Defense and Veterans Affairs departments have little interest in uncovering the true causes of their ailments.

"In its short history, the program has funded more trials of promising treatments than all other government programs combined in the 20 years since these troops came home sick," said Jim Binns, chairman of the Research Advisory Committee on Gulf War Veterans' Illnesses. "It is by far the best hope to improve their health and to prevent similar illnesses in current and future conflicts."

In the past, Binns said, VA research focused on the mental health issues of veterans of the 1991 Gulf War, while the Defense Department stopped funding research on Gulf War illness several years ago. Now, the Defense Department's Congressionally Directed Medical Research Program (CDMRP) exists only because Congress designates money to the Defense Department budget each year to study Gulf War illness.

But on Sept. 15, the Senate voted to exclude the program from next year's Defense Appropriations Act, while the House, after a last-ditch amendment from Rep. Dennis Kucinich, D-Ohio, voted to fund it with \$10 million.

### Old veterans benefits cuts may be new road map

Posted: Wednesday Oct 12, 2011 16:46:44 EDTCongressional researchers have supplied the Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee with a list of veterans programs cut since 1980 in the name of deficit reduction, providing a potential road map for what lawmakers could recommend as part of the current effort to reduce federal spending by \$1.2 trillion over 10 years.

The Oct. 7 report from the Congressional Research Service, a nonpartisan arm of Congress, makes no recommendations. It simply lists the cuts in veterans' programs made in 1980, 1981, 1982, 1985, 1987, 1989, 1990, 1993 and 1997 as part of past budget-cutting legislation.

Some of these cost-cutting measures have expired and could be used by the Joint Select Committee on Deficit Reduction, which is required to come up with recommendations for ways to cut the deficit over the next 10 years.







## Basic Wilderness Survival Skills From: British Columbia Outdoor Wilderness Guide

Fear - For anyone faced with a wilderness emergency survival situation, fear is a normal reaction. Unless an emergency situation has been anticipated, fear is generally followed by panic then pain, cold, thirst, hunger, fatigue, boredom and loneliness. It is extremely important to calmly assess the situation and not allow these seven enemies to interfere with your survival.

**Pain** - Pain may often be ignored in a panic situation. Remember to deal with injuries immediately before they become even more serious.

**Cold** - Cold lowers the ability to think, numbing the body and reducing the will to survive. Never allow yourself to stop moving or to fall asleep unless adequately sheltered.

**Thirst** - Dehydration is a common enemy in an emergency situation and must not be ignored. It can dull your mind, causing you to overlook important survival information.

**Hunger** - Hunger is dangerous but seldom deadly. It may reduce your ability to think logically and increase your susceptibility to the effects of cold, pain and fear.


**Fatigue** - Fatigue is unavoidable in any situation so it is best to keep in mind that it can and will lower your mental ability. Remember that in an emergency situation this is often the bodies way of escaping a difficult situation.

**Boredom & Loneliness** - These enemies are quite often unanticipated and may lower mind's ability to deal with the situation.
