"Search and Destroy"

Recently our Congress and the Media have brought to our attention two issues that have become related. The expanded use of remotely piloted aircraft (drones), not just for reconnaissance and surveillance in a combat zone but also for the delivery of lethal force and how the targets of that lethal force are selected and justified and how it relates to the inalienable rights that are guaranteed by our Constitution. Further, although the Air Force Operates these drones in Afghanistan, the CIA is operating drones in Pakistan, Yemen and Somalia where we are not, officially anyway, at war.

Automatic Death Warrants

Drone technology, on the one hand, limits the exposure of friendly fighters and pilots to enemy fire. However is it the latest slippery slope for **death** warrants to be conveniently issued by politicians and those who report to them with totally bypassing judicial review and provisions of the 4th, 5th and 6th Amendments. Under the Obama Administration drone flights and drone strikes and targeted killing have mushroomed.

Justification

Recently Michael Isikoff at NBC News had obtained a 16 page Justice Department white paper with the apparent purpose of justifying extra-judicial killing, even of American Citizens. It doesn't have to be by drones, but drones seem to be the natural choice with high value targets and high production of kills. And we don't seem to be concerned with so called collateral damage, that is killing of innocents

Most of the reports classify targets as suspected, alleged, or of military age.

"The paper's basic contention is that the government has the authority to carry out the extra-judicial killing of an American citizen if "an informed, high-level official" deems him to present a "continuing" threat to the country. This sweeping authority is said to exist even if the threat presented isn't imminent in any ordinary sense of that word, even if the target has never been charged with a crime or informed of the allegations against him, and even if the target is not located anywhere near an actual battlefield. The white paper purports to recognize some limits on the authority it sets out, but the limits are so vague and elastic that they will be easily manipulated".

Unless you actually turn those boasts into a creditable action or order somebody under your control with the means to do it, or possibly provide them with the means to do it. How is that determined?

Now if somebody in the U.S. were to rob a bank or murder someone, it wouldn't make much difference what his citizenship was either, because for you to imprison or execute him you would have to indict him and take him to trial and prove his guilt. It's called due process. It's guaranteed by the 5th and 6th Amendments.





New medal for drone pilots outranks Bronze Star

The Pentagon is creating a new high-level
military medal that will recognize drone pilots
and, in a controversial twist, giving it added clouby placing it above some traditional combat valor
medals in the military's "order of precedence."

The Distinguished Warfare Medal will be awarded to pilots of unmanned aircraft, offensive cyber war experts or others who are directly involved in combat operations but who are not physically in theater and facing the physical risks that warfare historically entails.

The new medal will rank just below the Distinguished Flying Cross. It will have precedence over — and be worn on a uniform above — the Bronze Star with Valor device, a medal awarded to troops for specific heroic acts performed under fire in combat. The new medal is a brass pendant, nearly two inches tall, with a laurel wreath that circles a globe. An eagle is in the center. The ribbon has blue, red and white stripes.

Experts: Drones basis for new global arms race


The success of U.S. drones in Iraq and Afghanistan has triggered a global arms race, raising concerns the remotely piloted aircraft could fall into unfriendly hands, military experts say.

The number of countries that have acquired or developed drones expanded to more than 75, up from about 40 in 2005, according to the Government Accountability Office, the investigative arm of Congress. Iran and China are among the countries that have fielded their own systems.

"People have seen the successes we've had," said Lt. Gen. Larry James, the Air Force's deputy chief of staff for intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance. The U.S. military has used drones extensively in Afghanistan, primarily to watch over enemy targets. Armed drones have been used to target terrorist leaders with missiles that are fired from miles away.

The United States is years ahead of the world in the technology of drones. Israel is also a leader in developing the unmanned aircraft.

A Marine sergeant heard the news over the radio: A Predator drone was about to fire a Hellfire missile at <u>Taliban</u> fighters near Building 58. The sergeant, crouched with his team behind a low wall in an Afghan poppy field, asked a corporal to check the location of Building 58. The corporal pulled out a map. It took him less than a minute to pinpoint the building.

"Building 58 is the wrong building," he said.

Almost at the same moment, "Seventeen seconds to impact," crackled over the radio.

Houston-based Marine Staff Sgt. <u>Jeremy Smith</u>, 26, and Navy corpsman <u>Benjamin Rast</u>, 23.

At least a dozen people in three different U.S. states and two bases in Afghanistan watched the tragedy unfold live on the drone's video feed. Messages and images passed instantly across thousands of miles through secure chat rooms and via satellite - a miracle of modern warfare. But somehow the one message that might have halted the strike never got to the right people.





... but judging by the LAPD's shoot-first, verify-later spree of open-firing at the wrong people, Dorner has reason to fear he'll never get his day in court, says Matt Pressberg at the USC Annenberg journalism school's Neon Tommy. That should worry all of us. Due process "is not only a bedrock constitutional principle (Fifth Amendment) in this country, but one of the key underpinnings of freedom period." And if our government "can simply be the executioner and disregard judge and jury" — be it for Dorner or Anwar al-Awlaki, the U.S-born al Qaeda operative killed by a drone in Yemen, followed soon after by his American son — "individual rights effectively don't exist." An excerpt:

As an American citizen accused of a crime, Chris Dorner has his Fifth Amendment rights. The facts on the ground don't make it seem as if LAPD was all too interested in respecting them.... Alleged is not just a term journalists need to use to avoid the ire of a cautious editor. It's part of civilized-world jurisprudence. But now it seems like Americans have little use for alleged criminals who need to be brought to justice. Their attention is on terrorist madmen who must be stopped before they murder our children, and if innocent people get killed in the process — well, it's a dangerous world and we can't take chances.

Chris Dorner... is a dangerous guy with nothing to lose and it's not unfair to call him a domestic terrorist, as LAPD Chief Charlie Beck did. However, just because he's a terrorist, it doesn't mean he can be summarily executed, whether he's in Yucaipa or Yemen. The media bears some responsibility for our tolerance of Big Armed Brother. Scary stories get eyeballs, and when the news oversamples these rare events, people think the world is a much more frightening place than it really is and are more willing to submit to invasions of their privacy to calm their intentionally stoked fears. To paraphrase one of the people behind the Constitution, people willing to give up liberty for the feeling of security deserve the TSA. http://theweek.com/article/index/239985/christophernbspdorner-drones-and-the-death-of-due-process





Fear - For anyone faced with a wilderness emergency survival situation, fear is a normal reaction. Unless an emergency situation has been anticipated, fear is generally followed by panic then pain, cold, thirst, hunger, fatigue, boredom and loneliness. It is extremely important to calmly assess the situation and not allow these seven enemies to interfere with your survival.

Pain - Pain may often be ignored in a panic situation. Remember to deal with injuries immediately before they become even more serious.

Cold - Cold lowers the ability to think, numbing the body and reducing the will to survive. Never allow yourself to stop moving or to fall asleep unless adequately sheltered.


Thirst - Dehydration is a common enemy in an emergency situation and must not be ignored. It can dull your mind, causing you to overlook important survival information.

Hunger - Hunger is dangerous but seldom deadly. It may reduce your ability to think logically and increase your susceptibility to the effects of cold, pain and fear.

Fatigue - Fatigue is unavoidable in any situation so it is best to keep in mind that it can and will lower your mental ability. Remember that in an emergency situation this is often the bodies way of escaping a difficult situation.

Boredom & Loneliness - These enemies are quite often unanticipated and may lower mind's ability to deal with the situation.

Motivation
